PARKING

Retirees are eligible to purchase an EM/RE permit which is an EM-P (employee premium) permit at the price of an EM-S (employee standard) permit. Retirees can find prices or purchase their permit online at parking.iu.edu, or through the Parking Operations office in the Henderson Parking Garage (visit in-person Mon–Fri from 8a–5p, or call 812-855-9848).

MEMBERSHIPS & PRIVILEGES

- IU Retirees Association membership. Complimentary for the first year, then \$20/single or \$30/couple annual fee thereafter.
- Retain IU Library system privileges and IU email account
- University Club membership (paid by Indiana University). Visit uclub.indiana.edu/membership-benefits for details.
- Emeriti faculty and librarians may participate in Emeriti House programs and services, and automatically receive the program calendar electronically. All retired IU staff members are also invited to join the listserv (email emeriti@indiana.edu to join). Free parking is provided for program attendees in the nearby Atwater Garage. ATHLETICS

- Former employees with official IU Retiree Status can purchase tickets in the faculty-staff area and receive a 10% discount on tickets by emailing their name, IU ID Number, and the department they retired from, to iuticket@indiana.edu. Seating in the faculty/staff area is on a priority point basis.
- Two FREE admission tickets to regular season (non-tournament) sports other than Football and Men's Basketball with a current IU Crimson Card ID.

DISCOUNTS

- Purchase IU software (Faculty Retirees) and hardware (Faculty and Staff Retirees) at a discount, subject to vendor agreements.
- Access to IU Recreation Sports facilities at rates equal to those of current Faculty and Staff (e.g. SRSC, Intramural Center, IU Outdoor Pool, and IU Tennis Center).

TRAVEL

Travel Benefit Change Effective September 8, 2021: The Big Ten Academic Alliance contract with Enterprise National Rent-A-Car was renegotiated. This contract impacts all Big Ten schools, including IU. Unfortunately, starting Wednesday, September 8, 2021, rental car discounts are no longer available to IU Retirees. This change impacts retirees from all Big Ten schools. While we're disappointed this benefit has been discontinued, we want to remind you of the other travel benefits that are available to you as an IU Retiree including:

- **Local Hotels:** Traveling within Indiana? Check out the *Hotel Rates by Campus* page on the Travel Management Services website at iutransport.iu.edu to see a listing of hotels that offer discounted rates to IU retirees. Hotels are grouped by IU campus. Simply review the list of hotels available in the area, call the reservation phone number and state your IU affiliation to take advantage of the discounted rate. Please note: Local hotels have black-out dates when the IU rate is not available.
- **FastPark Airport Parking:** Traveling a little further? Take advantage of the FastPark discount available through IU. Benefits include reduced daily parking rates (\$7.95 per day, excluding airport taxes), free reservations, and 24-hour shuttle service.
